Academic Calendar Description: Natural languages are systems that enable human communication. In this course, we will explore how this fact makes human communication possible. An introduction to the methods of linguistic analysis, the course will enable students to understand how language works and to compare it with other languages. By familiarizing students with the basic concepts of linguistics, the course will prepare students for more advanced work in the field.

Additional Details: LING 1200.2 is the second half of a two-semester course. The first half of which is scheduled to be taught by Dr. Daniel C. The division of topics between terms is to be decided between Dr. Hall before the beginning of classes in September 2019. The course is based on *Language Files* (12th edition, Ohio State University Press).
