JOB SUMMARY & KEY RESPONSIBILITIES	The sessional co-instructor will be responsible for the online delivery of one 4 week section of PHYT 6140.06 Neuroscience for Physiotherapy students. This course is combined with OCCU 6140.06 Neuroscience of Occupational Therapy. This graduate level course in neuroscience will expose entry-level physiotherapy and occupational therapy students to the foundational and advanced neuroanatomical and neurophysiological concepts and knowledge needed for evidence-based practice in neuro-rehabilitation. The co-instructor would work in partnership on this online course with the Instructor of Record from Occupational Therapy

as well as internal instructors/guest lecturers. The co-instructor will be responsible for all aspects of teaching and administering the class which includes lectures, seminars, test preparation and evaluation of students related to the 4 week section of this course delivered May 4th to May 30th 2020. In addition, the instructor will hold online office hours for consultation with students during the four week section of this course.

The course involves lectures and seminar sessions on the microanatomy, gross anatomy, and neurophysiology of the brain and spinal cord. Examinations will emphasize the functional systems involving these structures. Weekly online seminars may be conducted to integrate neuroscience concepts into selected areas of physiotherapy practice.

General course objectives include;

1. Locate, identify and describe key brain and spinal cord structures, and understand the role that these structures play in neurological (dys)function.
2. Understand the organization of the major functional pathways of the brain and spinal cord, as well as the consequences of their (dys)function.
3. Discuss and apply concepts

related to nervous system development, neuroplasticity, motor control, sensation, consciousness, and higher cortical functions.

4. Explain the functional neuroscience of brain systems implicated in various neurological challenges.

5. Recognize, discuss and apply neuroscience knowledge as it relates to occupational therapy and physiotherapy practice with individuals experiencing neurological challenges.

6. Demonstrate effective communication and team dynamics necessary for effective interprofessional collaborative practice.

WORK ASSIGNMENT #1: An Instructor is required to assist in the teaching of the Musculoskeletal components of PHYT 5105 (Musculoskeletal PT Practice) and PHYT 6108 (Integrated Practice) from January 05, 2015 to May 29, 2015.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK: The modules are delivered through collaborative team teaching using didactic, self-directed, small group case-oriented problems, and lab sessions. The MSK components in the above modules provide students with an understanding of the core knowledge of the science and tools of orthopedic physiotherapy, including MSK tissue science issues, clinical reasoning, population health, and the development of musculoskeletal examination (subjective, objective), treatment and communication skills.

Throughout the modules, students practice prospective clinical

reasoning using a two stage hypothetico-deductive method where the initial subjective patient history and physiotherapy observation skills are applied to develop primary and secondary differential diagnoses and the patient examination is applied to confirm or disprove each diagnosis and arrive at a primary physiotherapy diagnosis. Students learn to direct treatment at the specific primary physiotherapy diagnosis, assess patient progress regularly using outcome measures recognized as best practice, document relevant subjective/objective information obtained from the patient using effective communication skills and convey appropriate information to clients, peers, and insurers.

REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION: Preferred candidate will have an advanced Master's degree and/or clinical specialization in orthopaedics, and be licensed to practice physiotherapy. Applicants must have a strong grasp of the subject matter, strong communication skills and have experience teaching graduate students.
