Preparing buffers and other solutions for immunocytochemistry. Making immunocytochemistry preparations of neuromuscular junction stained against variety of neuronal markers. Taking around 400 immunocytochemistry images using confocal microscopy. 3. Analysis of previously made microscopic slides with staining of neural connections and taking of series of pictures of best preparations (also about 400). 4. Processing and imaging tissues using electron microscopy of retina and neuromuscular junctions (approximately 300 pictures). 5. Grade students prelab quizzes and 3 lab reports. 6. Provide feedback from evaluation of assignments, and interact with students "one-on-one" during live office hours to help students interpret and apply feedback from assessments. 7.
