Course descriptions:

This course will focus on the elements of religious and spiritual systems that

are relevant in relations between Aboriginal people and the Canadian criminal justice system. It will examine the historical and political context, key religious and ethical concepts and practices of Aboriginal peoples, and the movement to employ Native spirituality in shaping responses.

The Department of Religious Studies requires the following qualifications and experience: The Applicants must have a graduate degree in Religious Studies or Theology and some experience with the Canadian justice system. The Department is particularly interested in qualified candidates who have first-hand experience working, teaching, and/or living within Aboriginal communities, who have a capacity to build connections with Aboriginal communities, and/or who are of Aboriginal ancestry.

Applications are invited in the first instance from part-time faculty colleagues who are on the Department's Precedence List. Applicants whose general qualifications have been reviewed by the university within the past three years need send only a short letter of application indicating that their specific qualifications are in accordance with those stated above. Other applicants should include curriculum vitae and arrange for two letters of reference submitted on their behalf. Transcripts from graduate courses and degrees are required for new appointments.
