WORK ASSIGNMENT: The duties of a <u>Teaching Assistant</u> include assisting the instructor in the presentation and delivery of a course, directly interacting with students and a combination of the following: tutoring, marking, demonstrating, monitoring labs, conducting discussion groups/tutorials, invigilating exams, field trips and assisting with teaching or other duties of a similar nature—both on campus and/or online.

The duties of a <u>Marker</u> include marking and/or grading the written work of students without direct interaction with students.

Most courses are offered in class, unless indicated otherwise. Teaching Assistants must have access to a computer with working internet to run Microsoft Teams for online meetings and instructions (no tablet/iPad/phone).
